SUBJECT: Dog Bite – *Police Seek Dog & Owner*

INCIDENT DATE/TIME: Saturday 09/10/11 @ approximately 5pm

LOCATION: Pheasant Branch Conservancy Trail; 6600 Century Ave

The Middleton Police Department is trying to contact a couple in their 30's, man about 6'5" and woman wearing a red hat, who were walking a small to medium size black and white dog in the Pheasant Branch Nature Preserve north of Century Ave and east of Allen Blvd at about 5PM on Saturday September 10, 2011.

They encountered a 67 year old man walking alone. Their dog jumped at the man. The couple apologized and everyone went on their way.

The man later realized that he had suffered a dog bite to his leg which broke the skin and potentially exposed him to rabies if the dog is not currently vaccinated.

Middleton Police need to identify the dog and determine whether or not the dog is currently vaccinated against rabies by Monday 09/19/11 or the man will be faced with the decision to undergo a series of injections as treatment for rabies. This can be avoided and the man relieved of this worry if the couple will identify themselves and their dog to the Middleton Police Department at 824-7300.

The police department is not going to take any enforcement action and is only interested in protecting the man from the need for treatment for rabies. If you are this couple or have any information, please contact the Police Department at 824-7300.
